The federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) of 2014 enacted a comprehensive youth employment program for serving **eligible youth, ages 14-24**, who face barriers to education, training, and employment. Funds for youth services are allocated to states and based on a formula.

At the state level services of the program are delivered by local subrecipient partner (youth serving) organizations selected via a competitive bid process.

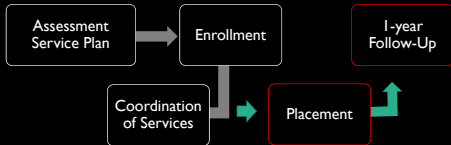
